Please do not drink and ride.



Women On Wheels® ... Then & Now!

Women On Wheels® has a long history ... and some of these ladies are still active members of our organization! Women On Wheels® (WOW) was founded in California by an avid woman motorcyclist, Arleen Ruby, in 1982. A newsletter was created called *The Wheeler*, membership quickly grew, and chapters were formed in California and other states. Arleen was a forward thinker and in late fall of 1984, she completed the process to register the name 'Women On Wheels' with the United States Patent and Trademark Office (USPTO). Those words are still registered at the USPTO!

As the organization grew, Arleen Ruby realized it was too big for one person to manage. In 1984, she sold the organization to P&S Management. At that time, P&S Management also owned the Gold Wing Road Riders Association (GWRRA). The new owner wanted to discontinue chapters and simply maintain the new magazine called *Women On Wheels*[®]. The first Ride-In[™] occurred in July 1987 in Marion, Illinois.

In late 1987, Sherry Jones bought the organization Women On Wheels®. She had handled the WOW account when employed by P&S Management. In 1989, these ladies also joined Sherry in ownership and then shared duties as membership and chapters grew: Kathryn Greenwood, Patty Mills, Peggy Scott.

Wisconsin members Sue Frish, Kathy Heller and Sue Konopka bought the WOW organization in 1992, and Linda Stone joined in ownership in 1994. They continued to build the organization. Women On Wheels® was honored to receive the Hazel Kolb Brighter Image Award in 1993, by the American Motorcyclist Association.

The last big change in our history occurred in 1998 ~ Women On Wheels® was incorporated in the State of Wisconsin as Women On Wheels®, Inc.; a non-stock, not-for-profit entity. Wisconsin Articles of Incorporation and By-laws were adopted. WOW would be managed by a volunteer Board of Trustees who were elected by the membership. WOW is still a corporation, and the original corporate management model is still in practice today!

Today, the same purpose remain — to unite all women motorcycle enthusiasts! Our WOW members have diverse backgrounds, and our youngest member is in elementary school, while our most senior members are in their eighties. Members ride every type of machine on the market. Some members never rode a motorcycle, and some are no longer riding but remain active in other ways. Members may affiliate with a specific chapter or may remain unaffiliated. ALL members are welcome to join in rides or activities of any chapter or state, at any time!

WOW provides information through the national web site, a public and member-only Facebook page, Instagram, Twitter, and other platforms. Currently, there are over 36 chapters across the USA and Canada.

The Story of Frogging

So, you want to know about the frogs, huh? It's simple, really. If you were "frogged" at the Ride-In™, it means that someone out there thinks a lot of you and wants you to know!!

The tradition of "frogging" someone was born at the 1994 Ride-In™ in Eureka Springs, Arkansas. Several WOW support members decided to do the 'guy thing' with a ride to Toadsuck, Arkansas – just so they could say, "been there, done that." They searched for souvenirs to prove their visit to Toadsuck.

Not one to be outdone, one ingenious member, who shall remain nameless, returned to Eureka Springs with a toad, which he somehow managed to put in my hotel bathtub. From there the little fellow made the rounds of several hotel bathtubs, although we never discovered just how they were able to get into our rooms! The next day, a fake hotel toad appeared in my bathtub. (Still, a mystery how they were getting into locked rooms.)

Eureka Springs hosts a specialty shop catering to frog lovers, and given that frogs, stuffed or otherwise, were easier to come by than toads, the tradition of "frogging" was born. For a while, frogs appeared at the most unlikely times and in the most unlikely places for most every WOW member in the State of Wisconsin. Of course, we ladies couldn't be outdone, so we 'frogged' the guys in return. It was rumored that Wisconsin's support members appointed a frog "procurement officer" who scoured garage sales for furry friends. This guy took his job seriously, and the frogs multiplied like, like, well – like tadpoles.

As time passed WOW friends from other states have found frogs on their bikes, in their tents, peering out of their luggage – anywhere and everywhere! It's taken on a life of its own these days, but basically, being "frogged" is a lot like getting a hug from a friend.

It's become a WOW tradition and a staple of our festivities!
